This year became the first for homecoming activities at VHS. No parade but the Senior class asked the V-Club to select the first queen for homecoming. After careful consideration, the V-Club chose a junior for their first queen and she has proven to be the

on many committees and was a cheerleader all four years

Homecoming 1951 came and their choice was announced...GLADYS WELLBROCK (PFEIFER) ('53)...FIRST QUEEN OF THE KNIGHTS. Not only did Miss Wellbrock make her mark as the first Queen at VHS but she also was THE only Queen selected who was not a senior...she was a junior. Likewise, Gladys was one of the queens crowned by the captain of the football team which was the practice for the first seven queens. Then in 1958, Bill Brungardt ('59) made his mark as the first King to be selected at VHS, crowning his queen, Bernadette Stramel ('59), during the homecoming half-time activities.

Parents Create Association to Link District with Community

In April of 1994, Victoria officially formed a PTA for the Elementary and Middle Schools. The local PTA organization is affiliated with the state and national levels.

The Mission of the Victoria PTA, in common with those of the National and the Kansas PTA, are as follows:

- To promote the welfare of children and youth in home, school, community, and place 1. of worship:
 - 2. To raise the standards of home life:
 - To secure adequate laws for the care and protection of children and youth; 3.
- To bring into closer relation the home and the school, that parents and teachers may cooperate intelligently in the education of children and youth;
- To develop between educators and the general public such united efforts as will secure for all children and youth the highest advantages in physical, mental, social, and spiritual education.

Serving as co-presidents are Mrs. Elizabeth Harris (school librarian) and Mrs. Mary Befort (parent), vice-president is Mrs. Wanda Karlin (Dreiling, '76, parent), secretary is Mrs. Gia Scott (parent), treasurer is Mrs. Betty Denning (Weigel, '65, parent), and the teacher representative is Mrs. Nancy Piatt.

Committees formed include: Newsletter, Fund Raising, Publicity, Hospitality, Campbells Soup Labels Program, and Concessions.

Parents with children in kindergarten through eighth grade or any interested adult may be a member of the PTA.

The organization's first fundraiser was an ice cream social following the spring concert and awards night. The PTA's present project is a Read-A-Thon in which the students obtain pledges for books read. Prizes will be awarded to winners. Funds raised from PTA functions will be used for various school programs and activities.

The members are also preparing for a carnival they will be sponsoring in May. (See page 2 for more on the Carnival.)

Mary Befort said she has been impressed with the support the community has given the PTA and she feels proud of what the organization has done for the school so far. She noted that the PTA was supportive of the incentive program for good behavior established in the Middle School. Wanda Karlin remarked that the organization has "gotten off to a good start." She stated that the PTA worked the concession stands for the Middle School basketball program and served supper for the teachers during parent/teacher conferences. The goal of the organization, Wanda said, was to use the funds they made to benefit the children.

"REFLECTIONS"

We held our first Victoria High School Alumni Banquet on Saturday, October 1, 1994. Of course, this reunion would cause many people to bring up many memories of the past. For instance:

Jerry Roth, a representative of the Class of 1941, mentioned that his class was the first to graduate from Victoria High School. Before that the school was known as St. Fidelis High School. His class's motto was "Life is a picture, so paint it well." He also said that in 1941 VHS published its first quarterly newsletter, titled "Victoria Lite". Eventually the paper's name was changed to "The Page". Jerry saw his first live elephant at the Wichita Zoo during the 1941 Senior-Class Trip.

Lawrence Weigel spoke for the Class of 1935. There were five boys and five girls in his graduating class. Eighty percent of them are still living. As a pastime in 1935, Lawrence said people told stories. He noted that the local fire truck was a wagon with a hose wrapped around a cylinder. Back then you could get seven gallons of gas for \$1.00. Wheat sold for 25 cents a bushel. Lawrence mentioned how during the Dust Bowl era they had to sweep dust off the school desks because the blowing dirt was so bad.

A couple of members of the Class of 1922, Loretta Wasinger and Barbara Knoll, also reflected on the past. Loretta described how they had to walk a mile to school carrying their sack lunches because there was no school lunch program in 1922. She remembered having to carry coal in for the night after changing from school clothes to old clothes. Barbara mentioned that Friday afternoons were set aside for a social hour back in 1922. Barbara noted that as a teacher in 1941 she was paid \$45.00 a month.

When John Braun, from the Class of 1984, was in high school one gallon of gas was \$1.05, a movie cost \$3.50, and sneakers were running about \$30.00. The all-school play that year was a roaring 20's spoof called "Speak Easy" that brought in a whopping \$26.00 causing the class to wonder whether they could afford a Junior-Senior prom. Ten years after graduation, 12 members of his class still live in Victoria, 16 live within 20 miles, and three reside out of state.

Ah, memories--aren't they grand? We can't wait until next year's reunion to hear more!

Craft Fair Successful for Scholarship Fund


The Victoria High School Alumni Association sponsored its first annual craft fair on October 9, 1994 in the Victoria Elementary




...1984
