Gerard Wellbrock: Sportscaster of the Year



to pay further dues to the Association. However, donations to the Association are welcome.

To determine your lifetime membership amount, calculate the number of remaining years you have until your 50th graduation anniversary. For example, a graduate of 1962 would have a 50th anniversary year of 2012. This person would then have 16 years remaining until they would become an honorary member. We would then take the 16 years multiplied by the current \$5.00 membership fee to arrive at \$80.00. A 5% discount would apply to this total which gives this person a lifetime membership fee of \$76.00.

Jason and Eric awarded financial assistance


