

News From Home

Health Care

The city of Victoria is happy to announce that the Victoria Community Health Facility is becoming a reality. The Ellis County Commission and Hays Medical Center with the help of the Ellis County Coalition for Economic Development have committed to bring these services to Victoria. On December 30, 1997, a contract was awarded to Commercial Builders, Inc. to construct the facility and work will begin as weather allows. The anticipated completion date is set for June 12, 1998. The city was fortunate to receive approval by the Kansas Department of Commerce and Housing to participate in the Kansas Community Service Program for this project. This authorizes a 70% tax credit to qualifying entities and individuals for cash contributions made to this worthy cause. The Victoria Community Health Facility will bring a medical clinic and emergency medical care to Victoria and the entire eastern one-third of Ellis County. The facility will house a health clinic, 24-hour paramedic service and ultimately a full time ambulance service. Also housed in the facility will be the Victoria Police Department.

Housing Development

Victoria is getting a new housing development. **Steve Robben '67** is responsible for annexing the property to the city. It is located one block east of Jefferson St. and will be a continuation of Kansas St. The addition will include 28 lots. Street and sewer construction for Phase I began in November of 1997 and will be comprised of six lots. These lots will be available in the spring of 1998. The addition will have large lots and wide streets for added convenience and comfortable living. If some of you would like to move back to your roots, give Steve a call at (785) 735-9434.

Meat Processing Plant

Smoky Hill Meat Processing is a custom slaughter and processing plant coming to Victoria. It will be located at 108 Ball Park Rd. Customers can bring their own animals in for processing. All natural beef by the side and quarter and all natural pork by the half and whole will also be available. Owners are Terry J. Werth and Jerry Kanzanbach. The plant will employ two people to start, with a potential of adding four to five more employees.

- The official enrollment at VHS for the 1997-98 school year stands at 108 students making it the smallest 2A school in Kansas.
 One less student and we would become a 1A school. We are still associated with the Mid-Continent League.
- Although we are small in numbers there are many positive things happening at VHS. Our students score well above state
 averages in all categories of the State Report Card. Our students are well prepared for higher education at VHS. Through ITV,
 they can earn up to 24 hours of college credit before leaving high school. Some of these classes are English Comp. I & II,
 psychology, sociology, speech, and human growth and development.
- Remember the good times in study hall? Study halls have been abandoned to accommodate the added courses necessary for graduation and college prep. Some of the new courses added to the curriculum are Applied English, Accounting II and Computer Applications III.
- The grading scale has been changed from (94-100 an A) to (92-100 an A). This was a district wide adoption. This grading scale better coincides with those throughout the state and hopefully will be significant when our students apply for scholarships.
- VHS track team will be sporting new uniforms this year, maroon shorts and gold tops.
- Students can use the computerized career and post secondary education search through the counselors office to find the perfect institution to prepare them for their chosen career.
- Sixty-five to seventy percent of Victoria High School senior students attend community college or four year colleges.
- Approximately fifteen to twenty percent of VHS seniors attend Vo. Tech. Schools.
- · Five to ten percent attend the work force or military.
