Reflections of Frank

It was in June of 1993 when I called Frank Dreiling '68 and Kathy Kuhn and asked them to come over to my house. They knew what I wanted because we had discussed the topic while we were preparing for our 25 year class reunion the previous month. Eagerly, Frank and Kathy responded, and it wasn't long after, that the three of us laid the groundwork for the organization of the Victoria Alumni Association.

That wasn't the first time I called on Frank for help. About eighteen years before that, my brother Wayne and I had asked Frank if he would help organize and direct the Victoria-based community variety show, Sweet and Sour Krauts. Once again, Frank had responded enthusiastically, and thus began the close relationship between Frank Dreiling and myself. We had been friends before that, and I even remember Frank and I teaming up to make popcorn for the third grade sale; however, from that point on we shared many more fond memories. These memories included many "Kraut" practices and shows, road trips, VFW stags, parties, bowling nights, the after-work Weller & water sessions, VHS Alumni meetings and functions, and those times when my wife Jeanie and I would just get together with Frank and his wife Kathy for an evening of fun. Unfortunately, those memories stopped accumulating when Frank lost his battle with cancer last November.

To know Frank was to know his sense of humor. Frank could make you laugh with his one-line sarcastic snips, or he could make you roll out of your seat with his half hour stories about his personal experiences with "Joe Walters and that itch of his," the time the Atlantic Ocean tried sucking him in at Atlantic City., or his teeing off-golf shot in front of a gallery in Arkansas. The hardest I ever laughed at Frank was when we were videotaping the Sweet and Sour Kraut Christmas Special. Frank was supposed to introduce the song "Sleigh Ride." As Frank was introducing the song, the horse with the sleigh carrying the singers, Jon Kisner and Frank's wife Kathy, was supposed to approach Frank from fifty yards behind him. Unfortunately, the horse didn't cooperate, but, fortunately, Frank got into one of his laughing and joking modes that had the entire cast and crew in hysterics.

I can truly say that Frank was my best friend. But Frank was so unique that there are many other guys that can truly say that Frank was their best friend, such as Sam Sander, Larry Urban, Marvin Miller, Wayne Billinger, Dick Werth, and others. I'm sure each one of them could tell how they got to be Frank's best friend. Outside of his best friends, Frank had many other friends. His warm personality and easygoing style made it easy to be friends with Frank. A church packed full of people for Frank's funeral was a testimony of his friendship.

But Frank was more than a friend to people. He was a great family man. While his proposal to Kathy was slow in coming, and fatherhood came rather late in his life, his love for Kathy and his delight in his daughters ran deep. In fact, during occasional "serious" conversations we had in the last two years, he described his worst fear would be to die and leave his two young daughters without a dad. Frank was also very fond of his sisters and his parents. In addition, it was noticeable that Frank got along very well with his co-workers on the job. As a Eucharistic minister, Fourth Degree Knight, and choir member, Frank was active with church affairs. Now I'm not saying Frank was perfect, but I barely heard Frank use profanity around me; probably because he thought I was using enough for both of us.

I still find myself breaking into tears at times from the loss of Frank because I miss him so much. But I also know that the Victoria Alumni Association is going to miss him dearly. Frank, we will miss all the time and effort you donated to working for the organization. You are gone, but you will never be forgotten.
