



Homecoming '99 in Review

The third annual VHS Scholarship Golf Tournament was held on Friday, Sept. 17, 1999. The golf tournament has been attracting some enthusiastic alumni. They might come for the game, but mostly for the camaraderie and delicious luncheon at Das Younger Haus. Winners this year were the following: 1st place; John Ruder '89, Darrel Dortland '89, John Weber '89 and James Dreiling '89; 2nd place: Randy Schmidtberger '66, Bruce Goetz '73, Earl Billinger '62 and Wayne Billinger '73; 3rd place: Gilbert Schippers '45, Bob Pfeifer '45, Vernon Berens '53 and Mitch Berens 81. The longest putt was won by Gene Wellbrock '56. Forty-four golfers participated this year to help build up our scholarship fund. This activity has had a steady increase in participation each year.

The K of C Hall was open on Friday afternoon for meeting with old classmates and friends. The parade honored past and present members of the Armed Forces. Grand Marshall's for the parade was shared by four alumni. Gilbert Leiker '38 and Jerry Roth '41 were given the honor as being the oldest veterans in attendance and Norman (Dale) Pfeifer '52 and David Pfeifer '74 earned the highest rank and had the longest tour of duty in service for our country.

Victoria High School was open for tours after the parade, and a tailgate barbecue was held before the football game. We had a pregame program introducing all military personnel present. After the game the alumni gathered at the K of C for more socializing and renewing of old friendships.

Saturday morning began with a memorial mass at St. Fidelis Church. Candles were lit while the names of the deceased from each class were read. A business meeting and luncheon followed in the grade school cafeteria. New members elected to the board of directors were Mary Kuhn Ruder '69, and Tom Schmidtberger '78.

Alumni, guests and friends gathered at the American Legion in Hays at 5:00 for cocktails and dinner, followed by another interesting and enjoyable program with Rich Billinger doing the honors as MC. The program featured the 50 year, 25 year, and 10 year classes as well as all 5 year increment classes who wished to be recognized.

Special recognition was given to the 38 servicemen and veterans in attendance. There were many impressive accomplishments mentioned, a few of which we would like to share with you. A. J. Schmidtberger '38 served in the ARMY-AIR-CORPS. He earned the rank of Corporal and World War II Victory Medal and South Pacific Campaign Medal. Robert Weigel '49 earned the purple heart. Norman (Dale) Pfeifer '52 served twenty years in the U.S. Air Force from 1955 to 1975. During his tour of duty he rose to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Dale had 204 combat missions in Southeast Asia. While serving on an exchange program with the NAVY, he made 253 landings on the U.S.S. America, and U.S.S. Franklin D. Roosevelt aircraft carriers. He earned the Air Force Commendation Medal, Distinguished Flying Cross with oak leaf cluster, Bronze Star Medal, Air Medal with 9 oak leaf clusters, National Defense Service Medal, Air Force Expeditionary Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, and Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal. Dale retired from the Air Force in 1975. David Pfeifer '74 is presently a Lieutenant Colonel in the Air Force stationed at Scott Air Force Base, Illinois. David entered the Air Force Academy after graduating from VHS and earned his commission in 1978. During his 22 years in the Air Force, he has earned the Meritorious Service Medal with 3 oak leaf clusters, Air Force Commendation Medal, Air Force Achievement Medal, and Combat Readiness medal with 4 oak leaf clusters.

The evening and weekend was concluded with dancing by young and old and the vow to "See you next year!"



Message From the President

The Victoria High School Association has been in existence since the fall of 1993. I would like to share a few thoughts about our progress and accomplishments.
