WILLIAM "BILL" KUHN, RICH BILLINGER, FRANK DREILING

WILLIAM "BILL" KUHN

'61 earned both a Bachelor and a Master degree from Fort Hays State University. He taught seventh and eighth



grade and was basketball coach Gorham Elementary School for one year. Bill accepted teaching position in Victoria in 1966 and remained there until his retirement

2001. In addition to teaching third, fourth, fifth and sixth grades, he coached basketball and track. He was also responsible for starting up the junior high football program. RICH BILLINGER '68 AND FRANK DREILING '68

In honor of the 21st anniversary of the founding of the Victoria Alumni Association, we will be inducting two of the founding members into the VAA Hall of Fame: Frank Dreiling '68 and Rich Billinger'68.

RICH BILLINGER '68 was born to Leo and Rita Billinger in 1950. He was raised in Victoria along with his four brothers, Vernon '59, Earl '62, Wayne '73, and Bill '77 as well as two sisters, Marlene Billinger Brown '61 and Mary Kay Billinger Pfeifauf '65. After graduating from VHS, Rich attended Fort Hays State and received a Bachelor degree in

Communication.



After college, Rich spent six years at McCracken High School, teaching English and coaching baseball. Also during this time, he served in the Hays Army National Guard, rising to the rank

of Staff Sergeant E6. In 1980, Rich began teaching at Hays High for 25 years, with the last ten of those years being devoted to being the broadcasting director for the school's cable Channel 13. During those years, he also coached baseball, and for seven years he co-directed the musical.

Rich and his brother, Wayne, created a community variety show in the late 1970s entitled *Sweet and Sour Krauts*. They both wrote, directed and produced the show for 14 years, except for two years when Wayne took a break and Rich wrote the entire show by himself. *Sweet and Sour Krauts* ran for 14 years and resulted in donations of thousands of dollars to charity, as well as to Victoria High School.

Rich also has many other interests. He is a member of FOURSTAR, a vocal quartet, and sings in the St. Fidelis Adult Choir. Retirement didn't provide Rich with enough activity, so he is currently working at Tom's Music House as a representative at schools in Northwest Kansas.

Rich and his wife Jeani have two sons, Chris of Hays, and James with his wife Kim who live in Overland Park with Rich's four grandchildren.

FRANK DREILING '68 was born on January 18, 1950 to Herb and Mary Louise VonFeldt '47 Dreiling. His siblings are: Susie Dreiling Windholz '69, Betty Dreiling Brungardt '73, Theresa Dreiling Brantley '74, Patty Dreiling Rohr '82, and a brother John, who passed away in 1965. Frank attended grade school in Victoria and graduated from Victoria High School in 1968. also an integral fixture in *Sweet and Sour Krauts*, mainly serving as Master of Ceremonies.

After a short courtship of 11 years, Frank married **Kathy Schulte '76** in Victoria. Frank and Kathy brought into this world two beautiful daughters, Holly Dreiling Lang and Hannah Dreiling.

Frank was nominated for this award because of his love for Victoria High School and Victoria, Kansas. He had an impact on many people; if you were a friend of Frank's, he was a true and loyal friend.

The duo of Rich and Frank once again got together in 1993 and decided they needed to develop another organization which is still very active today: The Victoria High School Alumni Association. Frank was so proud of his town and school. If he could be here today, he would be extremely honored to see the success of this organization.

Alumni Donation to Help "Jump Start" VHS Students

The Alumni Association Board of Directors has voted to donate \$1000 towards a newly created Jump Start Dual Credit Program at VHS. The idea behind Jump Start is to assist students to obtain college credit while attending VHS.

The curriculum at VHS is now structured so a student who is taking English 4 for high school credit can also receive college credit for English Comp I and II. The same is true for College Algebra, Speech, Psychology, Sociology

and Statistics. Any of these credits earned are transferable to any two or four year college in Kansas. If a student plans to attend North Central Kansas Technical College, they could also earn a credit for Business Math, but Business Math could not transfer to other schools.

The students who would benefit from this fund cannot be identified individually, due to privacy laws becoming more strict in the education sector. An easy way to think about this is to compare it to the HIPPA laws now in effect at hospitals. Likewise, VHS staff also cannot inform the public about certain activities of students at the high school.

The process of selecting recipients for Jump Start will be done by the faculty at VHS. There are a set of stipulations in place that a student would need to fall within before they could benefit from Jump Start.




