VHS Football Teams Slated to Be Honored at Homecoming 2016

Undefeated football team members from 1965 and 1966 are asked to mark Homecoming dates on their calendars. Members will be honored guests.

The Victoria Alumni Association invites all members of the back to back undefeated 1965 and 1966 football teams to Homecoming 2016. The team members will participate in the annual parade, be introduced during halftime of the homecoming football game versus Otis-Bison, and will be recognized at the Alumni Banquet on Saturday.

The 1965 team finished 7-0, defeating their opponents by a total of 230 to 25 points, with four shutouts. Their closest game of the year came versus the Ellis Railroaders. The Knights were able to defeat their cross-county rivals by a score of 13-12. After the scare of the Ellis game, Victoria did not allow a single point over their last three games, and defeated those opponents by an average of 47 points.

The 1966 team was a truly dominant force. They defeated every opponent by at least 27 points, out-scored their opponents by a total of 317 to 32, and had five shutouts. They completed their season a perfect 8-0. Unfortunately, there were no playoffs at that time, so both the '65 and '66 seasons simply ended after the team played out its schedule.

These were the third and fourth undefeated teams in VHS history, but the first to accomplish it in consecutive seasons. We are hoping many of you can make it back for homecoming to be honored, and we would also like you to bring back memories from those seasons to share with the rest of the alumni. 2015 Knights Claim State Championship

The 2015 Victoria Knights Football team completed an unblemished 13-0 season to claim the first back-to-back State Championships in school history. For the second straight year, the Knights faced Attica-Argonia in the championship game. In 2014, the Knights handily defeated the Titans 52-8, but the 2015 contest came down to the final minute. In a tied game, and on 4th down, the Knights offense was able to spring to life and scored the decisive touchdown with only two seconds remaining. The final score was 36-28. The Knights now own a 25 game winning streak that dates back to the second game of 2014.

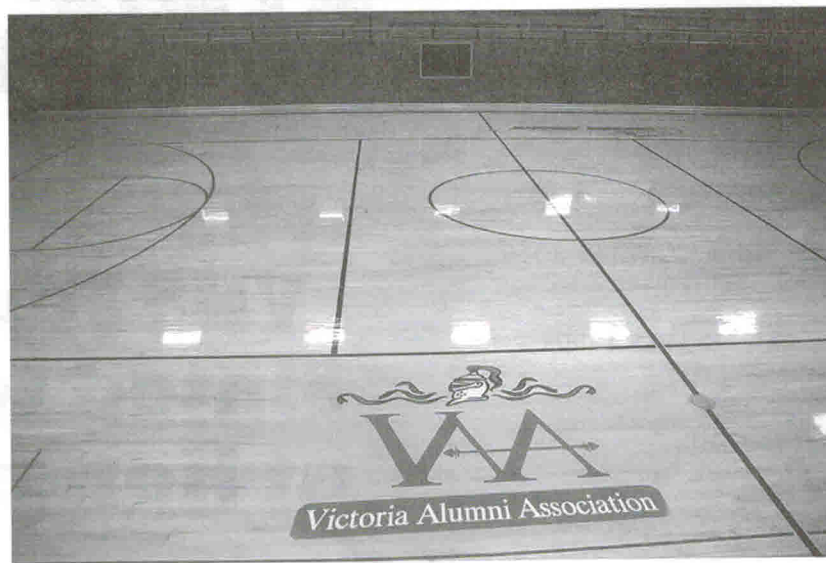
USD 432 News

Luke Johnson has been hired as the new band and vocal teacher.

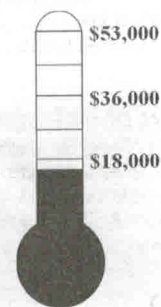

The campaign to raise funds for the replacement of the VHS gym floor is ongoing. There was hope that the floor could have been replaced during the 2016 spring break, but that time has now passed. As of March 1, the alumni of VHS have donated \$15,000 towards the gym floor fund. A big thank you goes out to all who have donated. Unfortunately, the lowest bid for the total replacement of the gym floor came in at just under \$53,000. As you can see, there is a \$38,000 deficiency that needs to be filled before this project can proceed. The next window of opportunity to replace the floor will be during the upcoming summer break.

From the VHS Principal

Last school year Victoria High School implemented dual credit courses into its curriculum. The primary purpose for this implementation was to increase VHS graduates' attainment of post-secondary degrees. It was our hope that if we could facilitate the completion of many of the general education courses at the high school level, students would have a higher program completion rate at a post-secondary institution because they would be able to enter more readily into desired course work rather than the typically dreaded general education courses.

We found, however, that providing these college level dual credit courses at the high school level did come with a substantial disadvantage. Due to the fact that these students are not yet high school graduates, they were unable to apply for financial aid. Many of the students who were most needing this academic incentive were socioeconomically disadvantaged and cannot afford the tuition for these courses without financial aid.

Thanks to the new Jump Start Grant, now every Victoria High School student who wanted to get a head start on his or her college education had that chance this year. 35 VHS students indicated a desire to take a dual credit course this year. Out of the 35 total students who wanted to take dual credit courses, 9 students applied for our Jump Start Grant. All 9 received financial assistance of either partial or full tuition thanks to the overwhelming generosity of the Dane Hansen Foundation, the Victoria Alumni Association, and North Central Kansas Technical College. Thanks to these organizations, we were able to award over \$3,400 to help make our students' dreams of a brighter future a reality. We cannot thank these organizations enough for all they do to better our schools and community.

WHY the Class of '55 did NOT have a YEARBOOK!!

For 65 years, every graduating class from VHS since 1951 has had a yearbook except one. It appears that information was only made public to the VHS Alumni last year when the class of '55 celebrated their 60th class reunion. In a statement made on a questionnaire handed out to the alumni at the banquet, it stated the class did not have a yearbook because of rowdy behavior. Now, 61 years later, I want to restore the good name of the "CLASS OF '55".

The decision was made by the Board of Education (Ben Brungardt, Emanuel Pfeifer, and John Schippers) that the class would not be allowed to solicit advertising from the local and area business establishments to raise funds to cover the production costs of the yearbook nor would the district finance the project.

In desperation I visited with the principal, Mr. Steve Ryan, pleading to convince the board to change their harsh decision. All to no avail!

The custom in the 50's was to reward the senior class with a bus trip to Colorado Springs toward the end of the school year. For this the class already had raised some money. At a class meeting, I made a motion to the class to use the trip money for a yearbook instead. Luckily, I didn't get tarred and feathered and run out of town by the boys in the class for making such a preposterous suggestion. When it came to a vote the boys voted "nay" and the girls "yay". We had 23 boys and 14 girls.

So the class of '55 had a senior trip for good behavior but no yearbook. Just to prove we weren't rowdy, we prayed the rosary all the way to Colorado Springs.

Alumni Association Recognized as Public Charity by IRS

The Victoria Alumni Association is now recognized by the IRS as a public charity. This designation was effective on October 21, 2015, and the important part for the alumni of VHS is that any money donated to the Alumni Association may be tax deductible. Of course, always consult with your tax-advisor, as every individual's tax situation is different, but for most people this should hold true.

The IRS has complicated rules

regarding how public charities classify any money that is collected. Do not worry; your Alumni Board of Directors will issue a receipt each January to inform you of your donation amounts from the previous year. Through some thorough research, it was determined that the \$5 annual dues may also be deducted because the IRS considers the alumni dues as "insubstantial."

In addition to becoming a

public charity, the Alumni Association has also been approved by the US Postal Service as a non-profit mailer. This will reduce the cost of mailing the biannual newsletter, allowing the yearly dues to remain at the insubstantial level of \$5.

Keeping the dues this low will only work if alums actually pay them, so please do your part and send in your donation to PO Box 382, Victoria, KS 67671.

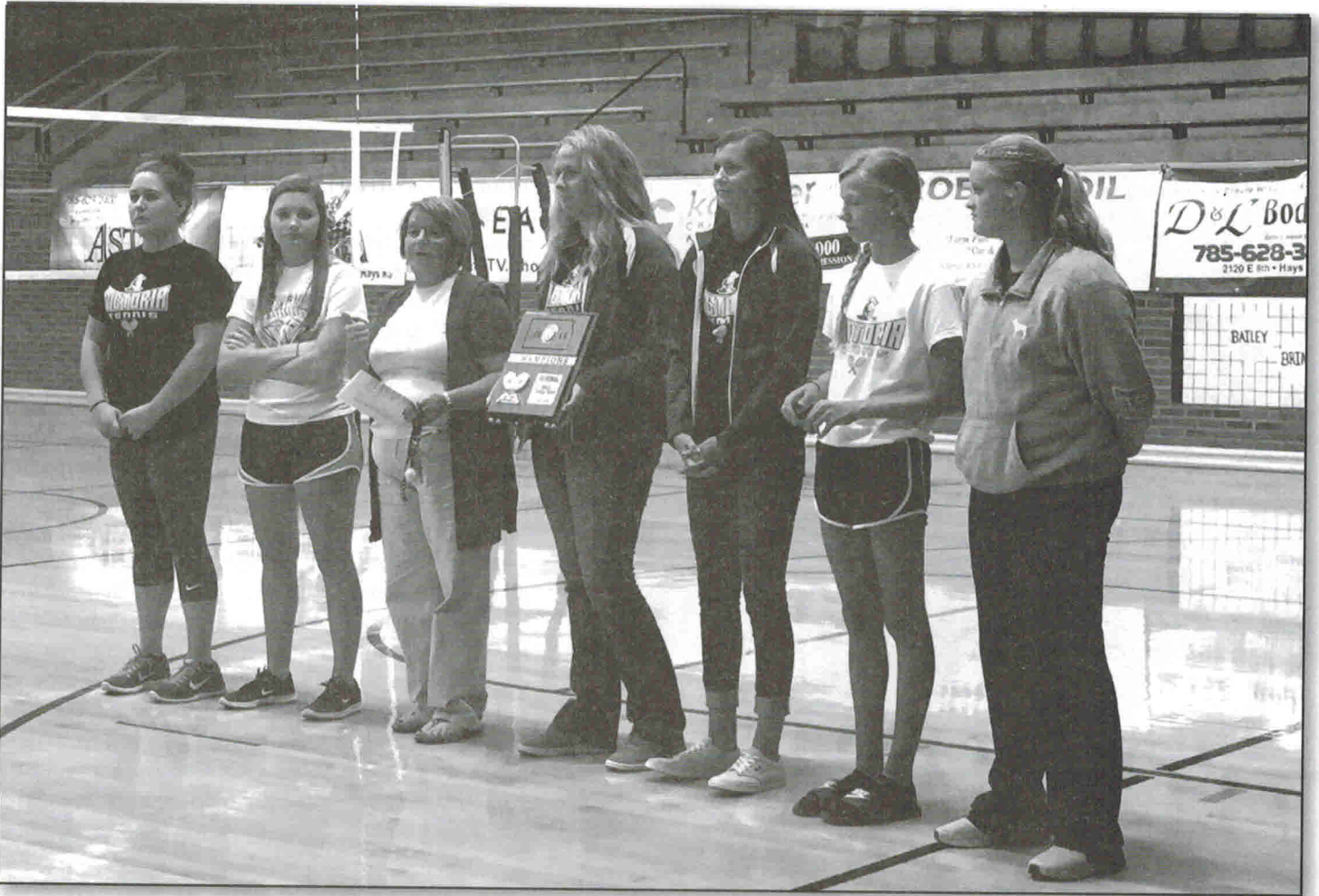

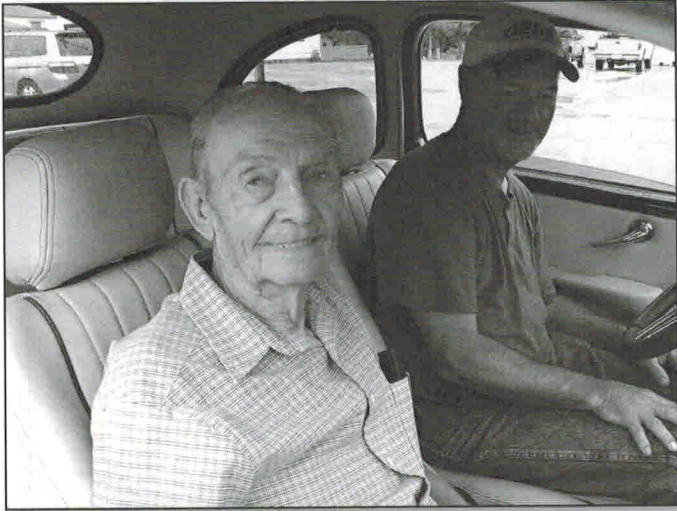

Mr. Johnson's efforts have also reestablished the community band. We invite anyone in the area who has ever played a band instrument to show up for rehearsal

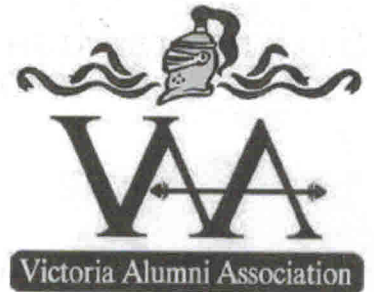
