## Windows covered at VJSHS



The Victoria Junior/Senior High School is shown with the new energy efficient material covering the top portion of the windows.

When the Victoria Junior/Senior High School was built in the late 1940s, electricity was slightly more expensive and it was a relatively new technology. In order to minimize the schools dependence on this pricey technology leap, large full pane windows that reached clear to the ceiling were installed in order to maximize the amount of free sunlight to illuminate the classrooms. For the most part, that plan worked wonderfully, especially on the south side of the building. Only on the cloudiest days were our teachers forced to turn on the overhead lights, and then the classrooms all looked a little bit different because they weren't beaming with sunshine.

All of that wonderful glass however, began to cost more than it was saving once the school became more modern with air conditioners in each classroom. The large windows not only let in the sunlight, they were an excellent place for the cold air to escape out of the room. Something had to be done, and the school board decided to continue to upgrade VHS. Starting this past summer, the top 2/3 of each window was covered with energy efficient materials. The auditorium's three large windows were almost completely covered, with only the lowest panes still showing. The savings were noticeable almost immediately. The air conditioners were not running as often during the day and the students seemed to enjoy having a little less noise to contend with while they studied.

### A Peek Behind the Scenes of the Alumni Board

The Alumni Board of Directors typically meets about five or six times a year. The meetings are always productive and there is usually laughter in the room. Even with only five or six meetings a year, it gets old sitting in the same room every time, so the board tries to mix it up by meeting at a restaurant once or twice a year. This past June, the board met at Gutch's Bar and Grill in Hays. After informing the waitress that there would need to be separate bills for each person, she began taking drink orders. Some ordered tea and others thought that a beer sounded like a good idea. Sandy Dreiling Goetz '82 was one of those that ordered a beer, but there was a problem. The waitress wasn't sure if Sandy was old enough and asked to see her ID. Sandy somewhat loudly proclaimed "I am 52 years old," but the waitress insisted that she didn't look that old and made Sandy show her driver's license. That was the first of many laughs had that night.

A short time later, the fact that there was a vacancy on the Alumni Board was brought Typically, filling a vacancy on the Board is a time consuming process. Due to not having a waiting list of individuals wanting to serve on the board, names of potential members are brought up and debated, with a candidate or two being agreed upon by the entire board. After being selected, the candidate is contacted by Alumni President Marge Rome '58 to see if he or she is willing to serve. Since the candidates are often contacted without knowing that they are being considered for the position, they usually ask for a few days to think about this. In a few cases, the candidate declines the position because they just don't think they can fit the responsibilities of serving on the Alumni Board into their schedule, and then the existing board members begin the task again of selecting the next potential member. It can at times be a long, drawn out process.

However, that was not the case when Jane Baier Schumacher '79 agreed to join the Alumni Board in June 2016. The board was meeting in Havs when Jane's name was brought up to fill a vacant seat on the board. Everyone seemed to agree that Jane would be an excellent choice and that she should be contacted. Rather than waiting until after the meeting, Kathy Dreiling-Amrein '76 grabbed her phone and sent a text to Jane asking if she wanted to serve on the board. In short order, Jane texted back and said that she would like to be the next board member. Jane was then sent another text telling her that the board was at Gutch's and if she had the time, she was welcome to join them. A short time later, Jane walked into the meeting and was welcomed. It only took about 20 minutes from the time that Jane was sent the initial text until she was seated with the board, a record that will be hard to break.

At the next alumni meeting, Mary Beth Leiker Fisher '76 announced that she would be resigning her seat on the board, effective at the end of Homecoming 2016. This is the second time that Mary Beth has submitted her resignation, the first having been in 2014. Back then, the Alumni Board was able to persuade Mary Beth into rescinding her resignation, but now she has decided that the time is right for her to turn her seat on the board over to someone else. A big thank you goes out to Mary Beth and her husband Ernie for all the time that they dedicated to the Alumni Association.

## VHS: Not Much Has Changed in 65 Years

There were 23 graduates in the class of 2016 and there was a striking oddity noticed as they completed their high school careers. A large number of their parents were also graduates of VHS. In fact, over half of the 2016 class had a parent or parents who were VHS alums. There were 15 of the 23 that became second generation VHS alums, and nine of those also became third generation.

This started off a discussion of how different VHS must have been for the most recent graduates versus what their parents or grandparents experienced. Of course there were the obvious similarities

through the years: the building itself, sporting events, the school play, and school dances, just to name a few. There was also an obvious difference. There weren't any computers in the building until the late 1970s and now every VHS student is issued an iPad. There didn't seem to be any way to get a good perspective of what VHS was like all those years ago compared to today.

The only way to compare VHS in different eras was to look at the courses offered to see how the educational emphasis has shifted through the years. A schedule of courses from the 1951-1952

school year was located and after going over the available courses from back then, there was one overwhelming conclusion to be drawn: VHS has barely changed.

Some of the courses have been divided to allow more specialized focus, but the overall direction of education is basically the same. The courses from 1951-1952 are listed below, with their counterparts from 2016-2017 listed next to them. It is truly stunning how little our school has changed in 65 years.






