
The individuals who comprised the original band are Jim Schmidtberger '70, Tony Pfeifer '74, Tim Pfeifer '76, Bill Gasper '74, Ray Schmidtberger '70, and the late Joe Dreiling '76.

The band started playing "greaser" parties in 1975, but Tony and Tim had already been members of their father's band, the Tony "Red" Pfeifer Polka Band, along with Bill and Joe. They would occasionally

# USD 432 Superintendent Ottley to retire this summer





Current USD 432 superintendent and long-time Victoria teacher, David Ottley, has announced his intention to retire at the end of June. Mr. Ottley will have the rare distinction of spending his entire career with the same school district. After graduating from Fort Hays State University, Mr. Ottley began his career in 1984 as a 5<sup>th</sup> grade teacher. Even as he was teaching the youth of Victoria, Mr. Ottley continued his own education at FHSU earning a master's degree in educational administration. In 1999, Mr. Ottley became a half-time teacher and half-time principal, sharing the principal duties with Linda Kenne, who spent the other half of her day as superintendent.

When Mrs. Kenne retired in 2015, Mr. Ottley was elevated to the dual role of superintendent and grade-school principal. Mr. Ottley has been described as one of a kind, and the Victoria school system is a better place because he chose to remain here for all those years. divert from the polka and waltz repertoire by playing a rock and roll number. After a few fun practice sessions with Jim, who at that time was in the band The British Hosters, the band now found their lead singer. Even though Ray wasn't the band's first bass guitar player, it wasn't too long before he assumed that position.

After Tony came up with the name Jimmy Dee and the Fabulous Destinations, the band was on its way. The band played its first major dance at the bar Skips, in Ellis, and members of the band were surprised when a large crowd attended. For future dances performed at the bar, the owner constructed a big building to hold the large crowds. It didn't take long for their destinations to increase across the state, and for the band to become extremely popular. They were now famous.

As time went on, the band didn't just play and sing 50's and 60's music. Added to their performance were colorful attire and energetic choreography, along with fun contests to get their fans more involved.

After years of success, the band decided to break up with most reasons being of a personal nature. Jim decided to start The Jimmy Dee Band, which took members to Europe and Honduras, while Tim and Tony started the band The Heat, which landed them a couple



of performances on the national TV show *Star Search*. The Pfeifer brothers also created another band which remains currently popular, Anthony and the Anamals. In 2000, however, the band decided they would reunite again as Jimmy Dee and the Fabulous Destinations.

During their original time together, the band cut a 45 record which featured on one side the single song "Eleanor," written by Tom Billinger '68, while the other side was the song "Gonna Have a Party Tonight," written by Tony Pfeifer. They also recorded an album simply titled Jimmy Dee and the Fabulous Destinations. For their second get-together, they recorded albums: two Roundtrip Summer Fun. During both times the band has been together, it has had other musicians fill in at times, and various people helped with the sound, lighting, and staging, including VHS alumni, Wayne

Billinger '73, Don Hart '76, and Brad Wagner '76.

In 2014, Jimmy Dee and the Fabulous Destinations were granted the honor of being inducted into the Kansas Music Hall of Fame in Lawrence.

They will be playing the alumni Homecoming dance following the banquet free of charge in gratitude for what the Victoria community has done for them over the years; however, they will take donations, which, in turn, they will donate to the Victoria High School music program.

# Marvin Dreiling, Grand Marshal shares memories of school in 1940s


The 2017 homecoming parade was led by **1943** graduate, **Marvin Dreiling**, doing the distinguished honors and duties of grand marshal.

Marvin, along with his wife of 64 years, Dorothy, and daughters, Karen, Kay, and Kristie, and their spouses, all attended the banquet. They were married in 1954. From this marriage came their five children, six grandchildren, two step-grandchildren, and one greatgrandchild. Marvin was the third child of Alphonse and Sophie Dreiling in a family of 12. All but one of his siblings graduated from Victoria High School.

High school times have changed immensely since the days that Marvin walked the halls. Banquet goers were treated to hear personal recollections of what school and life was like back in 1943.

Marvin was very proud of the fact that he lettered in baseball and basketball and had a beautiful letter sweater; unfortunately, it was lost in a fire of the Dreiling home back in the 40's.

Marvin was a student under County Superintendent Joseph T. Pfeifer. Hyacinth Roth was Marvin's principal as well as the manual training teacher and his coach for baseball and basketball. (Football was not yet offered at Victoria.) Marvin remembered competing against high schools in Schoenchen, Gorham, Dorrance, Bunker Hill, Luray, Wilson, and Waldo. Scholastically, Sr. Almeda Kuhn taught Advanced Algebra, his favorite class, and that is why Sr. Almeda was also his favorite teacher.



Band was taught by Charlie Bahl. Marvin played trombone and was very proud of his Franklin Trombone.




Members of Marvin Dreiling's family attended the banquet to help him celebrate his distinction as parade grand marshal.

After graduation Marvin was drafted into the United States Army during the Korean Conflict. He spent his time after basic training in Frankfurt, Germany, as a chauffeur for ranking military personnel.

What an honor and privilege to have him and his family at the annual alumni banquet. At the ripe young age of 92, Marvin spoke strongly and clearly into the microphone with gratitude and appreciation, stating that regardless of where life took him, Victoria would always be his home.

different Victoria bus and one suburban headed towards Hoisington to bring the kids home after their games.

Once the Victoria kids were back on their way, thanks to the Hoisington bus, Justin Scheck '96 took a look at the problem the stricken vehicle. He thought that it was simply a blown radiator hose.

When VHS custodian Wade Schmidtberger '00 arrived with the replacement bus, he and Justin were able to take off the broken hose. Now it was just a matter of finding a store that was open on Saturday.

Once again, the town of Hoisington had the answer as its auto parts store was able to find a matching hose for the broken down Victoria bus.

The best news of the day was that both Victoria teams were able to defeat Ellinwood and they headed back home victorious.

# Popcorn machines go "kaput"!





When this first became a problem, the elder musicians in the Victoria community came together to form the Victoria Community Band, but that group also saw declining numbers after a few years.

The annual spring concert for displaying the musical ability of the students is now a memory. There are a few soloists and small groups that still perform for the public at awards night. However, some of those performances are now utilizing smart phones for their accompaniment instead of a piano.

Luke Johnson was hired as music teacher for the Victoria schools in 2015, and he has spearheaded the rejuvenation of the Victoria music program. Numbers

have increased for the band and, thankfully, the pep band has reappeared at home basketball games and has been a welcome addition. Part of the reason for the increase of musicians is the fact that grades 7 through 12 are housed in the same building, and the formerly split Junior High band and High School band have been combined into one unit.
