Look for the 2018 VHS Homecoming weekend to be an exciting one for the Victoria Alumni Association members and guests.

One of the reasons the September 14th and 15th weekend will be more exciting than ever is because the Association will also be celebrating its 25th year of existence! Numerous things to enhance the celebration will include a special float created by the Alumni Association and a toast to the alumni success at the banquet.

Also adding to the excitement this year will be the induction of Jimmy Dee and the Fabulous Destinations into the VHS Hall of Fame. Previously inducted into the Kansas Music Hall of Fame, this high-energy rock 'n' roll band originating from Victoria and alumni of VHS will also provide the music for the banquet dance, which will ensure the dance floor to be full of movers and shakers.

There will also be the traditional events that happen every year during Homecoming weekend. Friday morning will begin with a golf tournament at the Fort Hays Municipal Golf Course with plans to move it along a little quicker this year to allow the golfers more time to enjoy the other Friday festivities.

At 2 p.m., the VFW in Victoria will open for any of the alumni to socialize. In the past, the older alumni from reunion classes have taken this opportunity to gather and visit, but in recent years, attendance at this social has dropped somewhat. Hopefully, there will be a great turnout this year.

In the afternoon will be the parade with the exact time yet to be determined by VHS, but in recent years, it has started at 4 p.m. This year's parade will include a float that features the fifty-year class along with the 25th Anniversary of the VHS Alumni Association and another float carrying the Hall of Fame recipients, Jimmy Dee and the Fabulous Destinations.

Then it's on to support the Knights with the football game kickoff at 7 pm. The Knight's opponent this year is Macksville. After halftime of the game, the Victoria VFW will be open again for the evening alumni social. The fifty-year class is on the ball and has already made plans to attend this social.

On Saturday at 4 p.m., a Memorial Mass will be celebrated at the Basilica of St. Fidelis in honor of deceased VHS alumni and teachers. If you have never attended one of these beautiful masses, you will definitely enjoy a moving experience. Following the mass, there will be a banquet at the Hays VFW (22nd and Vine), which includes a social, dinner, program, and dance.

In addition to cost of Alumni membership dues, registrants will pay \$30 per person, which covers the banquet dinner, dance, cocktails/beer, non-alcoholic refreshments, and snacks on Saturday night as well as Friday night's social with refreshments, beer, and snacks. If alumni choose to attend only the Friday night event, the cost will be \$5 each plus yearly dues. There is no charge for the Friday afternoon social where beer, refreshments, and snacks are also provided. What a deal!

Victoria FCCLA — Atlanta Bound

The Victoria FCCLA chapter was busy once again this past school year. One of the biggest areas of involvement for the chapter is STAR Event competition. There are over 30 different categories for members to compete. This year 22 members developed projects, displays, and speeches and competed at the district level in February. Eighteen of

those members received the top score SO thev advanced to the state level in Wichita in April. From there twelve members received the top scores and advanced to the National **FCCLA** Conference and STAR Event competitions June 27 to July 3 in Atlanta, Georgia.

The members presented their

During the trip, the students, their adviser Mrs. Connie Braun, and some parents participated in the conference, attended state meetings and workshops, as well as sightseeing. Mrs. Braun and several parents also served as STAR Event judges.

In addition to these achievements, the chapter has three members who were selected to be a part of the

> state Peer Education team called Financial Fitness. Ally Dinkel, Chantel Whisman. and Kinley Windholz assisted the state officer team, received training and planned their workshop while at Nationals.

In order to attend Nationals, the members had to raise over

\$13,000. It cost over \$1,000 per student to attend. They made 375 dozen cinnamon rolls to raise funds for the trip.

The group is extremely appreciative of all the community support and donations to make this trip happen. They could not have succeeded without this generosity. They were excited to represent our state and community.

This trip was the 11th consecutive year for the Victoria FCCLA to qualify for Nationals. Mrs. Connie Braun has had members qualify for Nationals a total of 15 years. She is extremely proud of all their hard work

and long hours but is most excited to see them grow into wonderful leaders.

Anthony is credited with coming up with the name for the band, "Jimmy Dee and the Fabulous Destinations".


