

## Rosalyn Schippers '48 Serves as 2018 Parade Grand Marshall

The 2018 homecoming parade was led by 1948 graduate, Rosalyn Pfeifer Schippers. She was pleased to accept the invitation for this prestigious honor. Rosalyn and her husband, Gilbert '45, were yearly attendees at every homecoming banquet and strong supporters of the Alumni Association. Gilbert died in 2013. He and Rosalyn were married in 1951 and were blessed with five children; Gerald, Mary Rose (deceased), Mike (deceased), Teresa Schippers Brown, and Tony.

Rosalyn shared her memories of attending Victoria High School. Her class of 1948 consisted of eleven girls and four boys. Some of the teachers she remembers were Sr. Annabelle, Sr. Petronella, Miss Ritter, Charles Bahl, and Hyacinth Roth. It was during this period in the school's history that the first lay principal was hired. Rosalyn's father was a member of the school board at the time, and she was approached by one of the nuns to

try to influence her father not to agree to this decision. Hyacinth Roth was named principal. Rosalyn played the flute in the band and continued her interest in piano. remembers especially She attending all the basketball games. All games were played at the opposing team's site as the upper floor in the high school was not adequate for game purposes. There were no activity buses so school board members transported the team in private cars and Rosalyn accompanied her father.

Rosalyn attended Marymount College in Salina, majoring in piano and voice. She taught grades 1 thru 8 at a country school for a few years. After marrying Gilbert, she taught private voice and piano lessons. Det Roth Younger was one of her vocal students at her studio located in John Quint's former ice cream parlor at the corner of 6<sup>th</sup> and Main. She continued teaching from her home for 20 years.

She and Gilbert own Gib's Auto Supply where she retired as office manager. She continues to check in at the store on a regular basis. At age 88, she is still very busy keeping up the family home, touching base with her children, grandchildren (11), and greatgrandchildren (20). She is a volunteer at Via Christi Village Care Center and is a long-time member of the choir at the Fort Hays Comeau Catholic Campus Center for weekly Mass.

Rosalyn's guests at the homecoming banquet were many of her family and her siblings. She was the oldest child born to Emanuel and Vera Pfeifer. Her brothers, Al Robert Pfeifer '50, and Norman Dale Pfeifer '52 were present. A brother, Larry Pfeifer '64, was unable to attend. Her brother Tom Pfeifer '57 is deceased. This was also her 70<sup>th</sup> Reunion as a member of the Class of 1948.



# German Food Served Up to Raise Funds for New Gym Floor

With a strong backing from parents of basketball players, the push to replace the Victoria School High Junior/Senior gymnasium floor has had a resurgence. The focal point of was fundraising push German meals that were held on Saturday and Sunday, March 23 and 24. A total of 1,015 tickets were sold for a meal featuring noodles and beans, creamed dumplings, and brats.

While many people in the nearby area were able to contribute to this fundraiser, this

wasn't feasible for anyone who lives far away from Victoria. Towards that end, if you would like to assist in replacing the gym floor, head over to the Alumni Website (<a href="www.victoriaalumni.com">www.victoriaalumni.com</a>) and click on the Gym Floor Letter for more information.

The need for a new floor was first recognized by former Superintendent David Ottley in September 2015. He approached the Alumni Board and requested that the Alumni Association spearhead the fundraising efforts. After many phone calls, emails, and text messages were exchanged by Alumni Board members, a letter was drafted and mailed to all alums of the Victoria school system.

The response that came from that mailing was just over \$15,000. It was a good start, but the lowest bid that was received for the gym floor replacement was right around \$53,000, meaning that the alumni donations were well short of what was needed.

By the end of 2016, another \$3,000 was sent in, pushing the total to \$18,000. In 2017, \$6,000 was donated and, in 2018, \$2,300 was added to the total. Since the gym floor replacement did not seem imminent, the Alumni Board recently decided to take \$26,000 of the money collected and invest it in a CD. There the money will remain until requested by the School District. Hopefully, that request occurs

sometime soon.

## Fire Chief Verlin Hammerschmidt Retires from Department

After 43 years of service, Victoria Fire Chief **Verlin Hammerschmidt** '63 retired in February of 2019. Verlin began his tenure on the Fire Department in 1976 and has held "every position possible" in the department. Even before the rank of Captain became an official designation, Verlin was a Captain. He was elected Chief in 2000.

In 1976, the Victoria City Fire Department had one fire truck, which was housed in City Hall, right next to the City Clerk's desk. In the late 1980s, the City and Ellis County Fire Departments were consolidated into one unit, and the city fire truck was moved to the county's garage. At about that same time, the county's fire house was expanded from a two-stall garage into a four-stall, with the county taking up three of the spaces and the city the other spot. Now,

the Victoria Fire Department has six stalls, with the city keeping two trucks and the county taking up the balance.

Over the years, Verlin said that one of the most memorable fires was when the Farmer's Grocery Store burned in 1989. That was an all-day fire, and it was so cold that the school district sent a bus to the fire so the firemen would have a place to warm up. The Farmer's Store was adjacent to the current City Hall building on the west side. Today, the Victoria Post Office is just west of where the Farmer's Store used to be.

The hierarchy of the Victoria Fire Department is full of alums. Replacing Verlin as City Fire Chief will be **Tom Tholen '74**. The Assistant Fire Chief has been and will continue to be **Kevin Klein '89**. **Kami Wellbrock Weber '94** is the Secretary, and the three fire Captains are **Chris Brungardt '81**, **John Weber '89**, and **Scott Wellbrock '99**. Out of the 18 active fire fighters, 15 have graduated from VHS.

Verlin would like to thank all of his fellow fire fighters along with all those who have served the City of Victoria for making his time with the department

enjoyable. He pointed out that without the City's support, the Fire Department could not function.
