building a table that includes an intricate top design made by Colby Schippers. The finished product was a surprise for Colin's birthday and now has a place of honor on his patio.



Ruth started her Homecoming weekend by attending the Friday afternoon social at the V.F.W. Hall with her daughters. It was easy to see that she made friends very quickly, and her friendly demeanor had people paying attention to what she had to say.

After the social, Ruth then took her place as the Grand Marshal of the Homecoming parade. Not only was she excited about the experience of being a grand marshal, but also, she was happy that the

parade route included a drive past her former residence on Main Street in Victoria.



# Hall of Fame

There are 56 members in the Victoria Alumni Hall of Fame. Would you like a voice in inducting the next group this fall? It all begins with writing a nomination letter for your potential inductee.

The Hall of Fame began as a way to honor teachers who made a difference in their students' lives. The first four "classes" of inductees were all teachers. Then those eligible for nomination were expanded to include secretaries, custodians, cooks, principals, superintendents, and school board members. Basically, anyone who has been employed by the school is eligible for the Hall of Fame.

In 2010, the Alumni Association began recognizing their fellow alums by creating the

"Alum-at-Large" category. All Victoria graduates are now eligible for induction to the Hall of Fame. To be considered for the Alum-at-Large, the individual must have made a significant contribution of their time and talent to their fellow man.

If you have a person you would like to see in the Hall of Fame, begin by writing your letter of nomination. There is also a nomination form on the alumni website,

which you can fill out and attach with your letter. The deadline for nominations is June  $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ . Your nominee could join this illustrious group as soon as this fall.




